**DECISION No. 1.33**

*On the compliance of the candidate  
for the position of judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine  
Roman Yaromenok  
with the criterion of high moral qualities*

The Advisory Group of Experts (hereinafter referred to as the Advisory Group) in remote mode using electronic video-conference means, consisting of the Chair of the Advisory Group Oksana Vasylchenko, Secretary of the Advisory Group Maureen O'Connor, members of the Advisory Group: Aleš Zalar, Yaroslav Romaniuk, Vasyl Shakun, Hanna Suchocka, in the presence of deputy members of the Advisory Group: Vitalii Makhinchuk, Thomas Griffith, Richard Barrett, Volodymyr Kuzmenko, having assessed the compliance of the candidate for the position of judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine Roman Yaromenok (hereinafter referred to as the "Candidate") with

the criterion of high moral qualities, under the Law of Ukraine “On the Constitutional Court of Ukraine” (hereinafter referred to as the “Law”), the Regulations of the Advisory Group of Experts, approved by the decision of the Advisory Group of Experts of November 12, 2023, with amendments approved by Minutes No. 10 of the meeting of the Advisory Group of Experts dated May 30, 2024 (hereinafter referred to as the “Regulations”), the Methodology for Assessing Moral Qualities and Competency in the Field of Law of the Candidates for the Position of Judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine, approved by the decision of the Advisory Group of Experts on December 4, 2023, with amendments approved by Minutes No. 10 of the meeting of the Advisory Group of Experts dated May 30, 2024 (hereinafter referred to as the “Methodology”),

**established the following**

1. Under part 25, Article 10<sup>2</sup> of the Law, the Advisory Group, among other things, assesses the moral qualities of candidates for the position of judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine.

2. Under Article 10<sup>8</sup> of the Law, the Advisory Group, within four months from the date of receipt of all documents submitted by the candidates from the Selection Commission for the Competitive Selection of Candidates for the Position of Judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine regarding the persons appointed by the President of Ukraine, the Committee of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine in charge of issues pertaining to the legal status of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine, and the Council of Judges of Ukraine, should review and study the submitted documents, the results of the special check, other information and materials received by the Advisory Group while exercising its powers, and after interviewing the candidate, having assessed

high moral qualities of the candidate, should make a reasoned decision on the assessment of compliance with the criterion of moral qualities.

3. The criterion “high moral qualities”, envisaged by Article 10<sup>8</sup> of the Law, is determined by the Advisory Group in the course of assessment of the “integrity” component through the indicators of independence, honesty, impartiality, diligence, incorruptibility, compliance with ethical standards and demonstration of impeccable behaviour in professional activities and personal life, as well as through the component of “the legality of sources of property origin”, “compliance of the standard of living of the candidate or his/her family members with the declared income”, “compliance of the candidate's lifestyle with his/her status”, the content of which is outlined in part 1, Article 2 of the Methodology.

4. Under paragraph 1, part 3, Article 10<sup>8</sup> of the Law, a candidate may be considered compliant with the criterion of high moral qualities only if he/she is of good integrity and there are no reasonable doubts as to the legality of the sources of his/her property, the compliance of the standard of living of the candidate or his/her family members with the declared income, and the compliance of the candidate's lifestyle with his/her status. Under paragraph 4, part 3, Article 10<sup>8</sup> of the Law, a candidate fails to meet this criterion if it is proved that s/he/she does not comply with it or there are reasonable doubts about his/her compliance.

5. On October 4, 2024, the Advisory Group received from the Competitive Commission for the Competitive Selection of Candidates for the Position of Judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine regarding persons appointed by the President of Ukraine the documents of a Senior Detective of the Fourth Detective Unit of the Third Main Detective Unit of the National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine, Roman Yaromenok, for participation in the competition for the position of judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine (letter No. ДІЕ-836/24-ref as of October 4, 2024).

6. The Advisory Group reviewed, verified and analyzed the Candidate's documents, his written explanations, and information received from public authorities, public organizations, state registers, databases, legal entities under private law, as well as data received from the National Agency for the Prevention of Corruption and the National Anti-Corruption Bureau of Ukraine.

7. On January 20, 2025, the Advisory Group interviewed the Candidate aiming, in particular, to refute doubts concerning the Candidate's compliance with the criterion of high moral qualities.

8. The Advisory Group has completed its review, verification, and analysis of the Candidate's documents, individually and in their entirety, the Candidate's answers to the Advisory Group's written questions and the Advisory Group's questions during the interview and has decided that the Candidate is compliant with the criterion of high moral qualities, given the following.

9. As of the day of the interview, the Advisory Group had certain doubts about whether the Candidate complied with the criterion of high moral qualities, namely, with such indicators of the "integrity" component as "honesty", "diligence", "compliance with ethical norms and demonstration of impeccable behaviour in professional activities and personal life", particularly regarding cases of his involvement in disciplinary responsibility.

10. At the same time, most of the doubts were dispelled as a result of the analysis of the Candidate's documents, both individually and collectively, the Candidate's responses to the written questions of the Advisory Group, and the questions posed by the Advisory Group during the interview, as well as other information the Advisory Group received during the Candidate's assessment.

11. Regarding the cases of the Candidate's involvement in disciplinary responsibility, according to Part 2 of Article 2 of the Methodology, when assessing compliance with the high moral character criterion, the Advisory Group may take into

account the seriousness or severity, the set of circumstances, and the presence of intent in any violation of integrity, and in the case of minor violations – whether sufficient time has passed without further repeated violations. In determining the severity of the violation, the Advisory Group considers all circumstances, including but not limited to the following: whether the violation was an isolated incident; whether the violation caused no or minimal harm to private or public interests (including public trust); whether this violation would be perceived by an objective observer as a manifestation of disrespect for public order arising from neglect of rules and regulations.

12. Considering the seriousness, severity, and set of circumstances identified during the assessment of the Candidate, the Advisory Group, guided by Part 2 of Article 2 of the Methodology, concluded that the Candidate meets the high moral qualities.

Thus, being guided by Articles 6 and 7 of the Regulations of the Advisory Group of Experts, approved by the decision of the Advisory Group of Experts of November 12, 2023, with changes approved by Minutes No. 10 of the meeting of the Advisory Group of Experts of May 30, 2024, the Methodology for Assessing Moral Qualities and Competency in the Field of Law of the Candidates for the Position of Judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine, approved by the decision of the Advisory Group of Experts of December 4, 2023, with amendments approved by Minutes No. 10 of the meeting of the Advisory Group of Experts of May 30, 2024, and Articles 10<sup>2</sup>, 10<sup>8</sup> of the Law of Ukraine “On the Constitutional Court of Ukraine”, the Advisory Group of Experts

**has decided that**

for the purpose of the competitive selection of candidates for the position of a judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine, the candidate for the position of a judge of the Constitutional Court of Ukraine Roman Yaromenok complies with the criterion of high moral qualities.
